There's a new book on the story trail on the Redpoll a cold hardy northern species that comes down to our Litchfield Community Park in winter. A winter tale by beloved Ukrainian author, Jan Brett. Grab your cleats or snowshoes and come on over to take a look. And while you're heading to the park or other outdoor adventures in cold weather it's important to avoid hypothermia and frostbite. Here are some safety tips to keep in mind:

1. Bring something to eat to keep up your energy.
 2. Have water with you - dehydration is still possible even with snow on the ground. Drinking melted snow makes you colder.
 3. Carry a whistle in case you lose sight of your friends.
 4. Stay dry; wet clothes absorb your body heat, so bring another layer.
 5. Keep your hands and head covered.
 6. Always tell someone where you are going.

Mailboxes and Snow Plows - Maine's Department of Transportation has a published guide for locating mailboxes to decrease the chance of damage due to winter plowing. Please take a moment to look it over on the Public Works page of our town website. Keep in mind that the wing height on our new trucks is 41 inches where the MDOT guide lists an older standard; also, that if your road was recently reconstructed, your mailbox may need to be raised to account for the additional 1 ½ to 2 inches of road height. If you have the option, adjusting the lower edge of your box to the maximum 45 inch height allowed by the post office is the best choice for plow trucks and paving.

Property Cards - Real estate property cards have been updated on the Town website. Look for the quick link on the right-hand side of the home page.

Budget Reviews - Town Budget reviews by department will begin at the February 23rd select board meeting and continue through the end of April.
