TOWN CLERK'S CORNER

2025-2026 Property Tax Bills have been mailed - 1st payment due 10/15/2025

Property taxes were committed on September 15th with a mil rate of 11.47. Litchfield's portion of RSU4 costs increased 6.6%, the County tax increased 17.5 % and the town budget increased 2.7%. Steep home sales price increases over the past two years created the need to factor valuations higher by 35% in order to keep up with the State's calculation of the town valuation. The effect of the factoring is a lower mil rate a resulting reduction in the effect of the homestead exemption. The very real result is double digit tax increases for many residents. If you bought property after April 1st, 2025, please contact the Town Office to find out your tax amount since Maine law requires bills to go to the owner of record as of April 1st. Payments may be made at any time, and you may make smaller, more frequent payments (monthly, for example, but to avoid interest, take into account that the October payment covers July through October).

The Road Commissioner is getting done after 11 plus years in the position and a legacy of outstanding local road work in all seasons. Anyone interested in applying for the soon to be open job of Public Works director / Road Commissioner may submit an application at the Town Office or online through the Indeed job site.

State General Election and Referendums-Voting will take place for the upcoming general election on Tuesday, November 4th, 2025 at the Sportsman's Club, 2261 Hallowell Road, Litchfield. Polls will be open from 8am-8pm. If you would like to request an Absentee Ballot, please visit https:// apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl or contact the town office. Ballots will become available in early October. In person absentee voting will also be available. Text Alerts: Sign up for Town Office text alerts by texting JOIN to (808) 289-8089. This is a program which we expect to use infrequently and primarily for emergency management announcements such as availability of warming shelters. We'll publish more information as this service evolves. 2026 Dog Licenses - You may license your dog(s) for 2026 at the Town office beginning October 15th or online at https:// www1.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog license/index.pl. If rabies vaccinations are due, please bring a copy of the new vaccination. To avoid a late fee your dog MUST be licensed by January 31, 2026. Rabies Clinic -A rabies vaccination clinic is scheduled for Saturday, November 1st from 9-11 AM at the Central Fire Station. Cost is \$20 with \$5 going to the Litchfield Fuel Fund. Litchfield Conservation Commission

Phen-ol-o-gy is the study of recurring natural events such as when leaves turn color in the fall or animals hibernate or buds open in the spring. Here are some fun fall phenology facts to look for out of doors. 1. Eastern hophornbeam is a small to medium sized understory tree in mixed woods known for its vertically peeling strips of bark. The fruit is bladder-like and occurs in clusters the resemble true hops. Each bract contains a single seed which can stay aloft on a breeze for a short distance. 2. Porquettes are old enough to care for themselves, but many still trail after their mothers. 3. Juvenile alewives have completed the journey down to the coast from their freshwater hatching sites. These "river herring" will spend most of their lives in the ocean. 4. Meadow Rue leaves turn yellow, pink and sometimes purple. 5. Over the past few month's woodland jumping mice have fattened up for hibernation by feasting on seeds, truffles and other goodies. Now they've curled in balls, their tails over their backs. 6. This year the Orionids meteor shower peaks during the night of October 22 to 23, with the best show occurring after midnight. This phenomenon occurs as Earth passes through the debris field of Halley's Comet. 7. Find a new fall story at the Litchfield Community Park Story Book Trail: from the Central Commons go up Porcupine Trail and take a left onto the Redpoll Trail. If you want, send your thoughts to the Litchfield Maine Conservation Commission Facebook page. 8. The Maine Conservation Corps will be gifting the town of Litchfield in October since we answered yes to Taylor Deely's kind offer: 'MCC Team Leaders are staying on for two weeks after the Field Season wraps up. We are looking for a meaningful project for them to complete for about three days in October. They will be staying at Camp Mechuwana, so housing is not a concern. Would Litchfield be interested in having 11 fantastic Team Leaders help with invasive projects from 10/21 to 10/23?
