TOWN CLERK'S CORNER

Last Year's Property Taxes- If you receive a "30 Day Notice" in the mail it means you have taxes remaining from last year and have a chance to get them paid in time to avoid the additional cost of having a lien on your property. Whether you forgot a payment, or are having some financial difficulties, if you have any questions or are concerned about the lien process, please don't hesitate to give us a call or stop by the Town Office (207) 268-4721.

This Year's Property Taxes- 2025-26 property tax bills will be mailed out in late September. The first payment will be due October 15th. If you would prefer to pay smaller amounts more frequently throughout the year, we accept payments at any time.

Town Office Will Be Closed November 5th – Voting Day- Voting for the Tuesday, November 4th, 2024 election will take place at the Litchfield Sportsmen's Club located at 2261 Hallowell Road from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM. There are two Citizen Initiatives on the ballot. Requests for absentee ballots are being accepted now. Ballots will be mailed out by October 4th, or as soon as they are received and early voting will also be available at that time.

Home Heating Assistance – Please don't wait until you run out of fuel! Upcoming Construction

Litchfield Conservation Commission

During the second week of August, 14 Maine Conservation Corps members worked in the community park and at local KLT properties, clearing trails, erecting a fence and combatting invasive plants alongside Litchfield Conservation volunteers. These folks worked very hard making town spaces better for all to enjoy. We're grateful! **Upcoming:**

The Board of Pesticides Control (BPC) and the Maine Department of Environmental Protection provide citizens with a responsible, free solution to collecting obsolete pesticides. All types of pesticides and adjuvants are accepted, including banned pesticides and pesticides that have become caked, frozen or otherwise rendered unusable. The program is available to homeowners as well as non-corporate farmers and greenhouse operators. Visit think-firstspraylast.org to register by Sept 26, 2025. After online registration, collection will happen in Augusta and other sites in October.

Woodbury Pond Park

The 2025 season is coming to a close. It has been a great season! Woodbury has been a nice recreational spot to hang out on a hot day or to reserve space for a group party. With the addition of a full-time attendant at the park, the park has been able to bring in some revenue for necessary upgrades.
