#### Tacoma Lakes Association

As I write this on March 20th, there is a possibility that the ice may be out on the lakes by the time you are reading this. This would be the earliest ice out date since I moved here in 2010. I thought I would offer a quick update on the status of the repairs to the Woodbury Dam. Thanks to Mark Evans, chair of the Woodburt Dam Committee for

supplying me with this information. Throughout this winter the water level has hovered very close to the winter standard of 6'. At this point all signs are pointing to an on-schedule increase of the water level to the 7' level. That level is 6" below the normal summer level, but is the level where the lakes were kept last summer to stop the seepage that was occurring on the eastern berm alongside of the dam. Additionally an engineering firm has been engaged to design and manage the needed repairs to the dam. The firm plans to complete the preliminary project details, and submit the plan to the Select Committees of both Litchfield and Monmouth by the end of March, or early April. The firm believes the necessary permitting can be completed in April, the final project design submitted, and bids opened for sub-contracting of the needed work in May. Currently it is thought that the necessary dam repairs can be scheduled and completed by the end of 2022. I am keeping my fingers crossed for a cool, rainy Spring. This type of spring allows a fungus to grow that hampers the growth of the infamous brown tail moths. I'm certain those who suffered with the brown tail itch last summer join me in sacrificing some of the Spring for a beautiful summer with no itching.

### **Town Clerk's Corner**

The Route 197 bridge over the Turnpike that has had stoplights this winter will be completely closed all summer for repairs beginning April 4th and is expected to reopen by the end of October. Project information may be found at https:// www.maineturnpike.com/route197.

**Participate in your local government:** There is still some time if you are considering running for an elected position this year, nomination papers may be picked up at the Town Office and must be returned by April 9th. In order to be listed on the ballot on June 14th, each nominee requires signatures from 25 town residents. Positions open for this coming year are on the Select Board (1); RSU#4 School Board (1); Budget Committee (2); and Litchfield Academy Trustees (3). If you are interested in how the town works, the Budget Committee is a great place to start. All paperwork must be returned by Thursday, April 14th.

**Requests for absentee ballots** for the June 14th state primary election are available online (search Maine Absentee Ballot Request) or go directly to https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl.. Ballot requests will are also available through the Town Office.

**Property Taxes-**The third and final installment of 2021 property taxes is due by April 15th. If you prefer to put your check in our drop box (to right of the entrance) please put the property address or account number on your check. You may call the office if you aren't sure of the final amount due. Our clerks can also help you with the option of paying your taxes monthly, or beginning to prepay next year's taxes.

**Town budget reviews** have begun. Each section of the town budget will be reviewed at upcoming Select Board meetings through the end of April. Don't wait for the annual Town Meeting to find out what's happening with the budget. Attending the Select Board meetings and following along during the reviews gives you a chance to hear the details, and an opportunity to ask questions.
