Conservation News

The Conservation Commission (CC) will host the Annual Litchfield New Year's Day Outing at 10 am in the Litchfield Community Park (LCP). Depending on the weather and participants' interests we will lead cross country skiing, snowshoeing or hiking (if no snow) groups on the various trails with different levels of difficulty. After, we can all meet up after for a fire and hot cocoa at the Central Commons. You can download a map of the LCP at litchfieldmaine.org beforehand. We will meet at the Town Office parking area. If there is rain or other bad weather, we will cancel by 8am and post on the Litchfield CC Facebook page. Plant native plants -plan for next year. For holiday bright red color try Winterberry, the native deciduous holly. You'll see it in moist situations and therefore needs good garden soil, full sun or a little shade and, like all hollies, needs a male for female plants to insure showy fruit. The straight species is 8' tall and spreading to 10' wide but 'Red Sprite' is a slow growing female plant that gets 4'tall and 6' wide; it needs an early blooming male like 'Jim Dandy' for pollination.

Town Clerk's Corner

Tax Acquired Property Sale -Five foreclosed properties in town are for sale, and bid packages are available through the Town Office. The Town of Litchfield is accepting sealed bids for the following properties (land only, except as noted): 1372 Hallowell Rd (Map R14, Lot 47); 2787 Hallowell Rd (Map R2, Lot 16); On Richmond Rd (Map R3, Lot 41); On Peacepipe Dr (Map U28, Lot 86); 13 Nutting Ln, trailer only (Map R4, Lot 46-ON-27). Bids accepted up to and including 4 pm, Monday, Dec. 12, 2022 at the Town Office, to be opened at 7 pm during the Select Board meeting. Pick packets up in person, or email taxinfo@litchfieldmaine.org. Tax maps are viewable at www.litchfieldmaine.org/maps.

Property Taxes - Tax bills are out now that the RSU4 correction vote was approved. The mil rate of 15.72 was originally chosen in September. It's a large increase and related primarily to the higher regular school budget (not for a building addition, that was voted down in August). In addition, this year Homestead and Veteran's exemptions are reduced by 1%, as the State has Litchfield valued over 10% higher than our 2018 revaluation, due to last year's increase in home sales prices. We expect next year's State number will go up more significantly and the Select Board will consider an adjustment at that time. For those with exemptions, the 1% decrease adds about \$5 to your tax bill.

Senior Property Tax Freeze -For those who applied to the program by Dec 1st, next year's property taxes will be frozen at this year's rates. There have been some questions about whether the form says this year or last year, and we agree it could have been stated better, but the state has told us it is the 2022 tax rate that will be frozen starting with the 2023 tax year.

Rte 197 (Richmond Rd) Bridge Update: The Maine Turnpike Authority has told us the bridge will be open before the end of December 2022. However, additional paving work will be necessary in the spring, requiring single lane closures for a week or so.

Elections-A total of 1893 votes were cast during November's general election. The candidate totals are posted online and available at the town office. The RSU4 Corrective Budget Referendum passed with 974 Yes, 880 No, and 25 Blank.

2022 Dog Licenses -You may license your dog(s) for 2022 at the Town Office (licensing began October 15th) or online at https://www1.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog_license/index.pl. If rabies vaccinations are due, please bring a copy of the new vaccination. To avoid a late fee your dog must be licensed by January 31, 2023. **Snowmobiles** -Snowmobiles may be registered at the Town Office,
