The news on the state of the Woodbury Dam is all good. Damkeeper Terry Averill reports that the first phase of the repairs to the dam, the sandbags, are in place and the winter water level of 6' is holding. More importantly, there is no evidence of any leaks downstream from the dam. Recently Litchfield Town Manager Kelly Weissenfels, Selectperson Rayna Leibowitz, Dam Committee Chair Mark Evans, and Dam Committee member Kate Goodspeed, met with Monmouth town officials. The great news is that Monmouth officials recognize the severity of the Woodbury Dam issues, and are on board with the Town of Litchfield, regarding the need to get the required repairs done in a timely fashion. The Dam Committee is ready to submit its application to the Dam Repair and Restoration Bank, pending the receipt of the engineering report outlining the cost for phase two of the repair process. We are all hopeful that phase two will take place in the fall of 2022, and that those repairs will offer a long term solution to the current leaks at the dam. Litchfield Broadband Committee

As of this writing, the Town of LItchfield is finalizing broadband contract details with Redzone Wireless. This agreement will bring broadband options to ALL Litchfield households and businesses. Watch for updates once the agreement has been signed. Households that currently use cable TV services have likely heard about streaming services as a way to 'cut the cable cord'. The website CNET has recently put together a thorough summary for those that may want to cut the cable cord and stream their TV content. This includes both streaming services and devices. See details below: CUTTING THE CABLE CORD 'Cutting the cable TV cord doesn't mean you have to give up your favorite channels. You can stream them live, including sports like the NFL, NBA and NHL, as well as live news from CNN, Fox News, MSNBC or your local TV station. One way to watch live shows without cable is to connect an antenna, but your channel selection will be relatively small. If you want more options you should check out a live TV streaming service. They deliver numerous familiar live channels, features like cloud DVRs and the ability to watch not only on TVs but also on phones, tablets and computers -- all with no cable box or contract required. Six major services are available today: AT&T's DirecTV Stream (formerly AT&T TV, AT&T TV Now and DirecTV Now), Google's YouTube TV, Disney's Hulu Plus Live TV, Dish Network's Sling TV, FuboTV and Philo.
