Broadband Committee

We are all very excited about the Broadband Agreement announced by Kelly Weissenfels in this month's Clerk's Corner. With the implementation of this agreement, the Broadband Committee will meet the Select Board goal to provide broadband to ALL locations within Litchfield in 2022. According to Redzone Wireless CEO James McKenna, the service is able to connect unserved and off-grid locations wirelessly. Redzone's purpose-built technology is specifically engineered to form a non-line-ofsight last-mile bridge between the fiber network and the home. Once constructed, Redzone will cover any future costs for operating expenses, technical support, network, maintenance and technology. "We're happy about (the Redzone addition), because it's going to increase competition," Kelly said in a recent interview with the Kennebec Journal. "But anybody who is happy with their existing service can keep it. It's not an exclusive contract, so the idea is that we can get unserved households served quickly. This is a very high-quality addition to the currently available offerings." Redzone is planning an information presentation to Litchfield residents on Thursday, January 27, 2022 at 6:30 PM at the Litchfield Fire Sta**tion**. They will provide plan details, information on streaming alternatives to TV cable boxes, and will be prepared to answer individual households' questions after the presentation. We are all very excited to welcome Redzone to our town, and we encourage everyone to compare their service plans against the other available providers doing business in Litchfield.

There is a new internet option in town! The Town of Litchfield has just signed a public/private partnership agreement with Redzone Wireless, a Maine company located in Rockland. Our town is contributing 30% of the infrastructure costs utilizing federal American Rescue Plan Act funds made available to the town for broadband infrastructure (no bond required). Conservation News: Browntail Moth caterpillars

According to the Maine Forest Service Kennebec county has the highest number of acres consumed by Browntail moth caterpillars: 108,138 acres. The state total for 2021 is 198,000 ac up from 156,000 ac in 2020. We need a normal wet May and June to encourage the native pathogens (fungus and virus) to control the caterpillars. We have been in a three year cycle of spring drought. What can you do? Since one nest can have from 25-400 caterpillars, depending on size, and since these nests are at the tip of tree branches, the Maine Forest Service recommends clipping webs between October and mid-April before caterpillars emerge from winter webs and begin feeding on new leaves. Clip and destroy the nests by soaking in soapy water. The silky compact nests are visible against the skyline and a pole pruner can help extend your reach. Learn as much as you can by going to the Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry: Browntail Moth (BTM) Frequently Asked Questions (maine.gov) You can also telephone 211 which will answer questions.
