## WINTER NATURE DAY CAMP WITH FRIENDS OF THE COBBOSSEE WATERSHED

The Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed's annual Winter Nature Day Camp will be held during February school vacation week at Camp Mechuwana on Lower Narrows Pond in Winthrop. Two (2)-day camp sessions will be offered-February 20 & 21 and February 22 & 23, 2023 with an inclement weather make-up day scheduled for February 24 just in case. Both sessions, open to children in grades 3rd-5th, will run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. each day and will include a mixture of indoor and outdoor activities, including snowshoeing, winter tracking, and a variety of indoor and outdoor games. Cost for each 2-day camp session is only \$100/pp and includes the use of all equipment along with afternoon cocoa and snack. ## **Town Clerk's Corner**

The Town Office will be closed Monday, January 2nd, for the New Year's Day Holiday and for Monday, January 16th for Martin Luther King Jr. Day. It's winter in Maine, please drive carefully. Litchfield winter roads are among the best maintained in the area, but please drive courteously and give our plows some space. We monitor the weather and pre -treat icy storms whenever possible. But if roads ice up unexpectedly for the morning commute and will thaw within 2 hours, then by the time the trucks get there it would have been small gain at large expense. If the weather is iffy, the Road Commissioner drives the routes and will make the tough calls. If you are interested in joining the Public Works team, we have a space for a full-time operator / worker. Please contact the town office if interested (207) 268-4721.

We recommend that everyone have a highly visible address number on their house or mailbox. Hopefully you won't need it for emergency services, but you'll at least be helping your delivery drivers. A good option is the reflective address signs offered for \$20 by Litchfield Fire & Rescue. Order forms are available at the Town Office.

2023 Dog Licenses – \$25 late fee starts Feb 1 You may license your dog(s) for 2023 at the Town office (beginning October 15<sup>th</sup>) or online at <a href="https://www.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog license/">https://www.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog license/</a> index.pl. If rabies vaccinations are due please bring a copy of the new vaccination. To avoid a late fee your dog must be licensed by January 31, 2023.
