Litchfield Broadband Committee

The goal of the Town of Litchfield Broadband Committee is to support the Select Board in bringing quality, affordable broadband service to all households and businesses in town. Over the past year, the Committee has completed the following:

1) ConnectMaine Planning Grant - A \$8250 grant request was written by the Committee and awarded to the town. This grant covered 50% of the cost to develop a Planning Report for the mapping of current broadband capabilities here by an independent consultant. This completed Report includes mapping of served areas by incumbent service providers Charter Spectrum (cable) and CCI (Consolidated Communications phone DSL). The Report also showed unserved locations.

2) Maine Community Foundation Grant - Another grant request was written by the Committee, and \$7000 was received by the town in October. This provided funding for (a) a community hotspot at town hall, (b) upgraded video conferencing equipment for meetings there, and (c) computer literacy equipment and training for the Senior Advisory group at the Senior Center.

3) New Wireless Internet Provider to Litchfield: TK Networks, a wireless internet service provider from Auburn met with the Committee in early 2020. With no infrastructure costs to the town, TK Networks has connected over 100 previously unserved households in the past year with affordable, quality broadband service. This activity was quite timely given the need of many to learn and work from home during the COVID outbreak.

4) Digital Literacy Initiative at the Senior Center - Laptops, tablets, and printing equipment was procured for the Senior Center Advisory Group through the Maine Community Foundation Grant. This group participated in multiple 'Train the Trainer' workshops throughout the winter. There was focus on Windows, MacOS, and Chrome-OS basics, creating and participating in Zoom Calls, setting up contact lists, etc. The purpose was to improve the digital literacy of Litchfield senior citizens through skills gained by the Advisory group there.

5) Franchise agreement negotiation with Charter Spectrum - The cable tv contract with the town is currently up for renewal. Details and terms of the agreement are under review with participation by Deputy Town Manager Kelly Wessenfels and the Committee. 6) Request for Quote (RFQ) - Recently sent out to a dozen internet service providers doing business here in Maine - including to the incumbents Spectrum and CCI. Bidders have been provided a copy of the Planning Report. The purpose of the RFQ is to determine the best partner to support a build-out of the unserved areas here. The goal is to provide options for the town to review at or before the annual Town Meeting in June. If you have any questions, send us a note at <u>lbell248@gmail.com</u>.
