#### **Conservation Commission**

From May to July, you may see turtles crossing or laying eggs on the side of the road. Please take care to avoid these slowmoving residents. Did you know that a single turtle may only produce one egg-laying turtle every 30 years? Turtles reproduce quite slowly, meaning they will not overpopulate our waters. In fact, they provide a service by eating the invasive fish and plants that cause harm to our native species. Living in Litchfield, you may be familiar with Snapping Turtles, big dinosaur-like turtles with long, jagged tails. Did you know they are believed to be one of the most ancient organisms dating back 60-100 million years? They can be aggressive when on land, but are typically less aggressive in the water. The striped head and tail of the Eastern Painted Turtle makes it easy to identify. Painted turtles enjoy sunbathing on logs around our ponds. Maine's smallest turtle is the Eastern Musk which has a dark, rounded 2"-5" shell often covered in algae. It can be aggressive when provoked (like any wild animal), and releases a foul odor when handled. Maine has 4 turtles which are in jeopardy. If you see one of the following four, please don't touch it, and instead snap a picture from a far distance. Submit sightings of these species to MDIFW immediately by emailing derek.yorks@maine.gov or (207) 941-4475 1. Spotted Turtle recognizable by yellow polka dots on its back. 2. Wood Turtles are identified by the raised mounds on their shell which resemble the inside of a tree, circles in circles. 3. Blandings Turtles have very distinctive yellow chins and throats. 4. Eastern Box Turtle exhibit irregular orange or yellow markings like paint splatter on their backs. It is always best not to handle wildlife. If you do handle a turtle, please make sure to always send it in the direction it was headed (it does know where it's going). Afterward, wash your hands carefully as they do carry diseases that can be transmitted by touch. The Conservation Commission and Smithfield Plantation are once again sponsoring outdoor education with local school children. Yeah! The third graders will learn about vernal pools and salamander habitat one day and forestry on another outing. The fifth grade is studying water ecosystems and on a Day of Caring will map and help dig invasive plants from ponds in the Litchfield Community Park.
