#### **Broadband Committee**

Broadband Committee Update for October 2021The Town of Litchfield Internet Survey has been completed. In a three week period, we received over 350 surveys back. Thank you to everyone that took the time to participate.

The complete survey results are available on the Town of Litchfield website (<a href="https://www.litchfieldmaine.org/">https://www.litchfieldmaine.org/</a>. Some highlights of the survey include the following: About twothirds of the survey respondents reported having Charter Spectrum service. This aligns well with the percentage of people that have their service in town. About 70% of the people in the survey had 1 - 2 users in their household.75% of respondents that currently have internet service are either very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their service. For those that reported some level of dissatisfaction, the biggest issue was cost (45%), followed by quality/reliability (27%), and speed (20%). There is very extensive use of the internet in town for a wide variety of activities, including 47% or respondents working from home every day. 87% selected reliability as the most important element of future service, followed by widespread availability (56%), and low cost(50%). Only 10% of respondents felt that they had very limited computer technology knowledge. Others were at least comfortable with most tasks, others were computer savvy, and 12% even supported friends and neighbors with their computer questions. At least 50% were open to the options currently under consideration, but of course will require additional information when available to fully decide their position. The Select Board scheduled a workshop in late September to review the survey results with the Broadband Committee to determine next steps. **2021-22 Property Taxes** - Tax bills were mailed on September 17th. If you have not received a tax bill you may call the town office to find out what you owe. The first payment is due October 15th, with 2nd and 3rd tax payments due January 15th, and April 15th).

**2021 Dog Licenses** - You may license your dog(s) for 2021 at the Town office beginning October 15th or online at <a href="https://www1.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog\_license/index.pl">https://www1.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog\_license/index.pl</a>. If rabies vaccinations are due please bring a copy of the new vaccination. To avoid a late fee your dog must be licensed by January 31, 2022. # The Litchfield Sodalite

### **Conservation News**

Originally developed to detect enemy aircraft, radar technology later became a valuable tool for detecting precipitation events (i.e., rain and snow). Shifting dots on the radar screens that didn't represent aircraft or weather were dubbed "angels" due to their temporary nature. By the 1990s, many scientists knew that the occurrence of these "angels" were actually birds taking off on their nocturnal, migratory flights. Since then, scientists have developed the ability to monitor the migration events of birds, bats, and even insects (e.g., monarchs)! Understanding when and where wildlife migrate is helping to inform the development and operation of wind turbines to minimize collisions, reduce likelihood of collisions with aircraft, and better understand the impacts of light pollution on wildlife. Thanks to a collaboration between the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, Colorado State University and UMass Amherst, we can check the bird migration forecast anywhere in the United States, including Litchfield! Navigate to https://alert.birdcast.info/birdcast, click on 'Change location', and enter Litchfield, ME to see our 3-day bird migration forecast. If you see a high migration forecast, be sure to top up your bird feeders, refill your birdbaths, and step outside to listen and look for migrants passing over or arriving. A valuable migratory bird resting area is the Litchfield Community Park, and we invite the community to ioin the Litchfield Conservation Commission on October 9th to do some restoration work in the park. If you have the time to share, then we have a meaningful way for you to contribute, from trash collection and raking to trail work.
