Athletic Coordinator Position Available - The Town of Litchfield approved a stipend position for an individual/ individuals to work alongside the Recreation Committee to provide the children of Litchfield the following sporting opportunities: Soccer, Basketball and Baseball/ Softball. This/These position(s) can be seasonal – one person can do all three sports or it can be broken down to one, two or three different people. The stipend can be divided between each sport. The position would open prior to the beginning of each sport season, and close at the end of that particular season. The necessary skills for the job would include excellent communication skills, computer skills, and a very detailed, multi task oriented attitude. The duties would include, but not limited to: communicating with the Rec Committee, coaches, parents and town employees as needed. Attending monthly rec meetings - working with the online registration program, managerial work and fundraising for each sport and all other tasks necessary to make each sport opportunity a success. Chartering of teams, oversee registrations, email communications to all teams, organize team schedules, manage equipment, order uniforms, communicate with coaches and volunteers, schedule referees and umpires and other duties that may come up. Town Clerk's Corner

School Budget Vote!! - The 3rd attempt at passing a school budget is on Tuesday, October 3rd at the Sportsmen's Club from 8 am – 8 pm. Apologies for any inconvenience, the date changed after publication of last month's Sodalite. The proposed budget is an additional \$369,400 reduction since the last vote, for a total reduction of \$693,158 since the initial budget. 2023-2024 Property Tax Bills Delayed AND Valuations are Factored -Tax bills are delayed and will be mailed out after the RSU4 budget is passed. You will have up to 30 days after taxes are committed to pay your first installment. The 2nd and 3rd installments will be at the normal times. ALSO, the overall Town valuation was adjusted by a factor of 20% to keep up with the State's estimate in order to maintain the full value of homestead and veteran's exemptions. The short explanation: While taxes will increase, it is not because of the factor. A longer explanation: Once property improvements are applied and the taxes are committed, the same 20% valuation "factor" applied to all properties means your property tax due after factoring is the same as before factoring. In other words, factoring raises the entire Town valuation, and the way the math works, since the amount to be raised remains the same, there is an offsetting reduction in the mil rate.

State Election - Voting will take place for the upcoming general election on November 7, 2023 at the Sportsman's Club, 2261 Hallowell Road, Litchfield. Polls will be open from 8am-8pm. Information about the questions appearing on the ballot can be found at https://www.maine.gov/sos/cec/elec/upcoming/index.html If you would like to request an Absentee Ballot, please visit https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl or contact the town office. Ballots will become available in early October. In person absentee voting will also be available.

Road Re-construction Status - All summer road projects are nearly complete, with remaining driveway tie-ins and shoulder fill to be done in October.

2024 Dog Licenses - You may license your dog(s) for 2024 at the Town office beginning October 16th or online at https://www1.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog_license/index.pl. If rabies vaccinations are due, please bring a copy of the new vaccination. To avoid a late fee your dog MUST be licensed by January 31, 2024.

Rabies Clinic - A rabies vaccination clinic is scheduled for Saturday, October 21st from 9-11 am at the Central Fire Station. Cost is \$20 with \$5 going to the Litchfield Fuel Fund.

Snowmobiles - Snowmobiles may be registered at the Town Office starting mid-October, or online at https://www.maine.gov/ifw/atv-snowmobile/index.html.
