## LITCHFIELD FOOD BANK

Some folks in town have a great garden! We know because they have been generous in sharing their produce with our neighbors. We are very grateful. Your donations for masks picked up at Gowell's have been outstanding! The seamstress creating them is an angel in disguise! Please continue to wear your mask and know that there is a smile behind mine.

### Transfer Station

The Transfer Station was fortunate to acquire a 2018 TYM four-wheel drive tractor. This 39 horsepower tractor was used by the previous owner for one month and has only fourteen hours on the motor. The tractor came with a front bucket and we will acquire quick detach forks and a bush hog in the next few weeks. This equipment will allow us to load air conditioners, refrigerators, large televisions and other heavy items. We will bush hog the old dump area as required by Department of Environmental Protection. We received twenty large cement blocks which we will use to expand the leaf collection bunker as well as to construct a loading ramp for putting leaves into a high walled tractor trailer. Within the next few weeks we will have a construction company move gravel away from the front of the Swap Shop / Haz Mat building. This action will prevent rain water from flowing into the building. The construction company will also grade the roadway by the brush and leaf area. GLASS; the Selectmen have requested that we return to the practice of collecting glass in Glass Roll Off Container. They have made this request in hopes of the glass market opening up again.

### Litchfield Broadband Committee

\*The Litchfield Broadband Committee continues to focus on extending internet services to households and businesses in town that have little or no access to quality services. \*As mentioned at the July town meeting, we were awarded a planning grant from ConnectMaine. These funds were awarded to Litchfield to produce plans that define local broadband needs, goals and through digital inclusion efforts encourage adoption of identified best practices by participating municipalities and organizations. This plan will inventory existing broadband infrastructure assets within Litchfield and will include a gap analysis defining the additional broadband infrastructure necessary to meet identified needs and goals. An assessment of all Litchfield procedures, policies, rules and ordinances that could have the effect of delaying or increasing the cost of broadband infrastructure deployment are part of the process. This planning process will be carried out by Casco Bay Advisors. \*

\*We also want to help those that are technology challenged realize the advantages that the Internet can offer. Key partners that are collaborating with the Committee efforts are the Select Board, RSU4 school system, and the Senior Center. \*

\*We are awaiting to hear back on another grant for \$15,000 from the Maine Community Foundation Broadband Grant. If awarded, the funds would really help us with some town improvements. This grant does not require any matching funds be provided by the town. We are competing for this grant money with many other rural communities in Maine. Notification of grant awards is expected by Monday, September 14.\*

### Conservation News

On October 12 - 16 Litchfield will host a reduced (due to Covid) field team of the Maine Conservation Corps to make improvements to lands in Litchfield that are open to the public. The public is invited to attend and work with these young people who are trained to care of the outdoors with activities such as trail maintenance, sign replacement, picnic table repair, bog bridge repair, removal of invasive plants. We will be offering training in identifying and learning about native plants on the various sites where they will work so that the invasive terrestrial plants can be ID'd properly and removed.
