THE INTERNET SURVEY HAS BEEN MAILED OUT!

We have two potential provider options being evaluated: Charter Spectrum and Axiom Technologies. They have proposed two quite different proposals to service our town. To help determine the best direction for Litchfield, a broadband Internet Survey was created. This survey has been mailed to over 2,500 households and businesses here in town. This survey will only take five minutes of your time. It is CRITICAL to get feedback from all households and businesses to know which direction to proceed. So please take the few minutes it requires to complete this survey! The goal of the survey is to better understand household and business internet usage, needs, and current gaps. By returning this survey, your opinion will be counted. If you did not get one in the mail, you can find a copy on the town website www.litchfieldmaine.org and print out a blank form, or you can get a blank paper copy of the survey at Town Hall. Based on survey results and feedback, the Select Board with the support of the Broadband Committee will work to connect those that are presently not served (approximately 240 household and business locations unserved!) while improving options for existing connected households and businesses. Please complete the survey by September 8, 2021. Only one survey per household location or business is required. You can drop this survey off at Town Hall, Gowell's Shop & Save, or mail it back to: Litchfield Town Office, 2400 Hallowell Rd.

Litchfield Transfer Station

The weather is finally cooperating so we can get some of our projects started: we are currently cutting down trees to make room next to cardboard container for the glass container, tin container and the paper container. We will remove the trees then have the stumps removed. Next will have approximately thirty yards of gravel put in and leveled. Will not have cement pad for these containers this year We found out that the cement retaining wall and ramp is not tall enough for the frontend loader to load leaves into the trailer. We will add another row of cement blocks on top of the existing blocks and increase the height of the ramp. The mound covering the old dump has been mowed but with the rain and sun we have received along with the sunny days the grass has grown very rapidly. We will mow it again the next few weeks.

Town Clerk's Corner

Property Taxes -2021-22 property tax bills will be mailed out mid-September. The first payment will be due October 15th. If you would prefer to pay smaller amounts more frequently throughout the year, we accept payments at any time and our office staff is available to help calculate monthly amounts.

Last Year's Property Taxes -If you receive a "30 Day Notice" in the mail it means you have taxes remaining from last year and have a chance to get them paid in time to avoid the additional cost of having a lien on your property. Whether you forgot a payment, or are having some financial difficulties, if you have any questions or are concerned about the lien process, please don't hesitate to give us a call or stop by at the Town Office (207) 268-4721.

Road Maintenance and Ditching -Ditching helps lessen the effect of pavement damaging frost heaves by allowing water to drain away from the road beds. Many of our local roads have not been ditched in years. Our Public Works crew is working to change that, and is prioritizing ditching of roads that are due to be repaved. This will happen over a period of months and years, but if your property borders a local road and you have plants within the right-of-way that you want to keep, you should consider moving them. The right-of way extends approximately 25 feet from the centerline of the road.

Tacoma Lakes Association

By now most of you are aware of the leak that was recently discovered in the earthen berm alongside the Woodbury Pond dam. The Town of Litchfield recently approved a temporary fix to the problem, involving sandbagging and further testing. These repairs will be quite costly. Anyone wishing to donate can do so at the town office, or on the Preserve The Woodbury Pond Dam gofundme page. The more monies donated the better. The Tacoma Lakes impact on the area economy cannot be underestimated. Lakefront property owners contribute to the Litchfield tax base, and hundreds of boaters, fisherman, and families visit the area to enjoy the lakes on a weekly basis. It is important to note, that without a properly functioning dam, many camp owners would have a long walk to the water. Also, the threat of milfoil infesting the lakes continues to loom. Imagine the ramifications of a large milfoil outbreak on the local economy, dropping property values, and a loss of recreational activities resulting in a loss of revenue for businesses in the area. In short TLA needs as many members to support us as we can get. Our goal for this year remains set at 300, and we currently have 210 renewed members. Membership remains only \$15 per year. Membership forms are available online at www.tacomalakes.org, and can be mailed, or using PayPal online payments are accepted. Help support TLA, and you will be helping the local economy thrive.

Conservation News

Since the fall of 2001, members of the Litchfield Conservation Commission have been working to provide updates and increase accessibility to the Litchfield Community Park (LCP). Over the winter, members mapped current trails and prospected a *new* trail that we hope to see completed by this fall. A new map is being prepared for display at the LCP kiosk in the parking area closest to the trails. Additionally, a digital version of the park map will be shared on the town website and the LCC Facebook page. New signage was created by Diane's Signs & Services in Gardiner and will be installed by a crew from the Maine Conservation Corp during their time in Litchfield - September 20 - 30. We welcome volunteers to help and gain experience in identification of native and invasive plants; invasive plant control techniques; trail building and maintenance; boundary marking; and installation of new trail signs in the Litchfield Community Park. The next meeting of the Litchfield Conservation Commission will be September 8th at 6 pm via Zoom - please email Diane Clay at c1l2a3y4@gmail.com for the link to the meeting.
