Transfer Station



There are 2 **important votes** this month: **Monday**, **August 8th**, a special Town Meeting is called at 6:30 pm at the Town Office. Votes will be regarding – funding the repaving of the Central Fire Department lot (estimated \$114,000); amending the Fire/ Rescue ordinance to allow billing of insurance companies for accident responses; amending voting statutes to require write-in candidates to declare intention in order to be counted during elections. **Tuesday**, **August 9th**, an RSU4 school funding referendum from 8 am to 8 pm at the Sportsmen's Club. Vote on whether to fund an addition at the middle school for \$31,687,212. See the informational insert for more details.

It's that time of year again, when we can hear the distant call of the loon, majestic and melodic!

Through the summer month of August our local loon pairs leave their nests, with hatched babies on

swim, hunt, and enjoy their home here in Litchfield we must be careful not to approach too closely.

to disturb or upset them. If they use an alarm call and arch out of the water splashing and flapping

their wings, you are too close! This is called the "penguin dance" and it is a warning sign that they

slow down on the water! It is such a gift to share our waters with the loons of Litchfield, so we must respect their habitats and understand their way of life. For more information on our local parks and natural resources find us at the Litchfield Conservation Commission table at Woodbury Pond Park on August 13th from 12-3pm, or on Facebook (@LCC04350). Maine Audubon has been conducting a loon restoration project this summer in response to fewer chicks hatching in recent years. They received a grant to support this work following an oil spill in loon wintering habitat off the shores of Massachusetts. Folks are monitoring the loon populations on Little Purgatory, Woodbury, Buker, and Jimmy Ponds. Although we don't have official monitors on Sand Pond, several of us went out to explore during nesting season. The annual Loon Count was Saturday July 16 from 7-7:30 AM and every lake in Litchfield was monitored. Audubon will have the results available this fall. We encourage all of you who use the lakes to learn to identify the stress signals of the loons and keep your distance. You can also help by finding nesting spots and monitoring them from a distance to help Audubon learn which pairs are successful. Next spring there will be more loon raft building sessions, so if

feel threatened! Often it is difficult to see the loon chicks from a distance, another good reason to

you think one is needed you can find out how to correctly build and place one. For more information contact the Tacoma Lakes Association or Maine Audubon.

The Maine Audubon recommends that we observe them with our binoculars and never close enough
