Litchfield Transfer Station

On November 19, 2019 Maine Department of Environmental Protection Inspector Mike Parker met with me at the Transfer Station. The purpose of this meeting was to inspect the Transfer Station, discuss completed projects and projects that are scheduled to be completed. Inspector Parker advised that he was very pleased with the facility as well as the 2019 annual Litchfield Transfer Station Report to the Department of Environmental Protection. This was an excellent meeting!

On to other issues: Most citizens who deposit their cardboard go into the cardboard roll off container, walk to the wood barricade and throw the cardboard beyond the barricade. Then we have people who are too lazy to walk to the barricade. They just walk to door of the container and throw their cardboard on the floor.

We are still finding restricted items in all the containers. Example: we found PVC pipes, tin cans and a women's large black leather purse in the plastic container. I have to say that we are finding less restricted items now because we now have the manpower to better monitor the activity at the Transfer Station.

We may have to change one aspect of how we operate at the Transfer Station. I have been advised that there was a discussion on a local web site reference non-residents using the Litchfield Transfer Station. This may require us to have Transfer Station permits attached to the front window of vehicles. I will discuss this issue with the Board of Selectmen at their next meeting.

Tacoma Lakes Association

The Woodbury Pond boat launch was once again very busy this past summer. Certified boat inspectors were at the launch on Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and holidays throughout the summer. 1,838 boats were inspected, and 224 plant fragments were found. Fortunately, none of the fragments were identified as invasive species. The importance of these inspections cannot be overstated, as many lakes in our area have invasive plant infestations. Membership dues help the Tacoma Lake Association pay the inspectors, just one of the reasons why membership is important. At only \$15 per household, membership remains a bargain. Our membership drive is still underway and membership is open to anyone who enjoys the lakes or wants to help protect them for the future.
