### Town Clerk's Corner

**2022-2023 Property Tax Bills Delayed -** Tax bills are delayed this year due to an RSU4 budget validation error. They will be mailed following the November general election. The Town has mailed an explanatory letter to all property owners and it is also posted on the Town website

www.litchfieldmaine.org. Paying an estimated amount in October is encouraged to avoid back-to-back due dates. Town Office staff can help you figure out the amount of the first payment based on the projected mil rate of 15.72. The first payment will be due in December followed with 2nd and 3rd tax payments on the standard schedule, due January 15th, and April 15th.

**State Election** -Voting will take place for the upcoming general election on November 8, 2022 at the Sportsman's Club, 2261 Hallowell Road, Litchfield. Polls will be open from 8am-8pm. #### 2022 Dog Licenses

You may license your dog(s) for 2022 at the Town office beginning October 15th or online at <u>https://www1.maine.gov/cgi</u> <u>-bin/online/dog\_license/index.pl</u>. If rabies vaccinations are due, please bring a copy of the new vaccination. To avoid a late fee your dog MUST be licensed by January 31, 2022. **Rabies Clinic** -A rabies vaccination clinic is scheduled for Saturday, October 22nd from 9 – 11am at the central Fire Station. Cost is \$20 with \$5 going to the Litchfield Fuel Fund. **Snowmobiles** -Snowmobiles may be registered at the Town Office starting mid-October, or online at <u>https://</u> www.maine.gov/ifw/atv-snowmobile/index.html.

Home Heating Assistance -Applicants for the KVCAP Fuel Assistance Program should contact KVCAP directly by calling either 1-800-542-8227 ext. 1500 or (207) 859-1500 to schedule an appointment. Applicants may also access the KVCAP website (www.kvcap.org) click "For The Home", and select "Heating Assistance" to book an appointment online. Information is available in the Town Office.

With the recent dip in temperature and hints of gold and orange starting to appear

in the treetops, it's safe to say that fall is well underway here in Litchfield. As some

humans may be closing up camps or homes and heading south for winter, many of

our wildlife are starting journeys of their own. Alewives and smelt that hatched this

feed, mature, and eventually (after a few years) return up river to spawn. Many bird

species, from the magnificent Harlequin duck to the tiny ruby-throated hummingbird

summer are traveling downstream to their ocean feeding grounds where they'll

are flying south to their overwintering habitats. Even monarch butterflies endure incredibly long southward journeys this time of year. The parks and trails in and around Litchfield provide great places to witness these incredible animals on their journeys...Smithfield Plantation - Litchfield Community Park - Jimmy Stream Conservation Area - Small Burnham Conservation Area - Holman Conservation Area -Webber-Rogers Farmstead Conservation Area – Woodbury Nature Sanctuary This time of year is the best time [the writer's opinion] to visit our parks and trails. Most of the pesky flies, mosquitoes, and ticks are done for the year (but do still check for ticks year-round unless there's snow cover). Taking a hike is a great way to reduce stress, get some exercise, and see what's happening in our very own backyard. Always be prepared with water, appropriate clothing/gear, and if you won't be traveling with a phone (or if you lose service), be sure someone knows where you're going. Since many of these properties are maintained by families or

volunteers, please take photos and only leave footprints.
